Today's World as Christian Women" is a hybrid event that you may attend by Zoom, or in person at Church of the Transfiguration in Dallas. The Rev. Canon Stephanie Spellers and The Rev. Canon Carrie Headington will present on the topic of how we respond, as Christian women to the changes and challenges of the world. We'll gain insight into how faith inspires us to respond to injustice and need while sharing God's love. Canon Spellers brings a unique perspective from her work with Presiding Bishop Michael Curry and her own social justice work. Canon Headington, as well, will inspire us to look at our lives and what we can do to heal and reconcile diverse viewpoints. There will also be two workshops. Workshop leader Dana Jean asks What are you willing to risk? Confronting Gender, Race and **Privilege.** Our second workshop is led by Dee Sanders who says *It's Ours to Fix, Being a Social Justice Warrior*. We'll look at ways we can make lifestyle changes to create an environment that is more just and equitable.

• A savings account has now been set up for the diocesan Daughters. A nominal amount will be kept in this fund and it will be tied to the yet-to-be set up PayPal account for diocesan Daughters.
